Hau Te Ananui o Tangaroa was first commissioned in the early 1860s by Rangatira, Hēnare Pōtae.

The Museum team will present on the opportunities the redevelopment offers as well as their work on the whare to date. This includes how it is a central part of the new redevelopment, their commitment to cultural partnership with whānau and hapu, the rich related history of the whare and whānau engagement. The current hauora of the whare will be presented in relation to the mahi ahead towards re-installation.
